46 riders from 6 different states participated, ranging from beginners to experienced. Riders were awarded Champion, first, second, and third in each class. The Champion was award a green and gold Midwest Hobby Horse Championship blanket for their hobby horse.

We are looking forward to some of our members traveling to Michigan for the US Hobby Horse Championship in August.



KID APPROVED RECIPE



Chicken Burgers

Ingredients:

- 1 pound 98% fat-free,
- · ground chicken breast
- 1/4 cup barbecue sauce
- 1/2 cup green onions, finely chopped
- 1/4 cup celery, diced
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder (or 1 clove of garlic, minced)
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- Nonstick cooking spray
- 4 whole-wheat hamburger buns
- 2 cups romaine lettuce,
- torn or shredded
- 1 large tomato, cut into 8 slices

Directions:

- 1. Wash hands with warm water and soap, scrubbing for at least 20 seconds.
- 2. In a medium bowl, combine chicken, barbecue sauce, green onion, celery, garlic powder, and salt.
- 3. Using wet hands (to prevent mixture from sticking), form chicken mixture into four 1/2-inch-thick patties. Wash hands with warm water and soap after handling raw poultry.
- 4. Preheat a large skillet over low to medium heat and spray with nonstick cooking spray.
- 5. Place burgers in the preheated skillet. Cook until burgers reach an internal temperature of 165 degrees F as measured on a meat thermometer, about 5 minutes per side.
- 6. To serve, place each burger on a bun. Top each with 1/2 cup shredded lettuce, 2 tomato slices, and optional 1/2 tablespoon of cheese.
- 7. Refrigerate leftovers within 2 hours.
