### α Fair County 4-H Show Division

Compete at the Boone County 4-H Horse Show in available classes.

Points per class: 3 points for 1st place  
2 points for 2nd place  
1 point for 3rd place

### α Community/Education Division

Complete at least 3 different activities of the 14 listed.  
Each activity sheet worth 10 points.

1. Ride in a **parade**.
2. Assist with a **Handicapped Riding Program**.
3. Share your horse and/or horse knowledge with a **Youth Group** or **Special Interest Group**.
4. Present a **Horse Demonstration** or **Speech** during a 4-H communications event
5. Participate in an organized **Trail Ride**.
6. Participate in the **State 4-H Horse Contests** under photography, arts and crafts, clothing, or horse equipment.
7. Attend an approved 4-H Horse Camp.
8. Participate in a Horse Clinic.
9. Participate in an organized Community Service Project (4-H, school, church, civic, etc.).
10. Participate in the **4-H Horse Bowl**.
11. Participate in the **4-H Hippology Contest**.
  
12. Participate in the **4-H Horse Judging Contest**.
13. Attend 4-H Residential (summer) Camp.
14. Enter at least 2 other non-horse 4-H projects at the county fair. At least 1 must be entered in the Floral Hall (non-animal)

You may turn in up to two (2) activity sheets for items 1-9, but remember, turning in two clinics, for example, only counts as one of the 3 needed activities.
